#### **BACKGROUND**

- Mr Dean Bodle is the owner of the gym in which Fitness Institute Pty Ltd is located. Mr Bodle
  originally began the RTO as a way to train staff and as a process of recruiting personal trainers for
  his own business.
- Key clientele are members of the public who wish to become personal trainers.
- The organisation does not feel the need to currently expand its scope of registration, however if the need arises in the future it would consider adding the Diploma of Fitness to scope.
- The organisation has a third party agreement in place with Tweak Fitness Ingham, Genesis
  Cairns and Iron Gym Sydney. However, it is not renewing its agreement with Genesis and is not
  currently accepting any enrolments with Iron Gym. At the time of the audit site visit, active
  students remain with Tweak and Genesis.
